1. At the beginning of each academic session, college prepares its proposed academic calendar, which is uploaded in the college website. The proposed academic calendar is prepared according to the notices and circulars received from the affiliating university. Students are informed about the academic calendar of the college notifying the probable teaching days, dates of internal examinations, curricular, extension related and co-curricular activities.

2. Based on the departmental routine, departments conduct meetings for allotment of classes and syllabus distribution among the teachers. Students are given details of teaching assignment of each teacher at the beginning of a session by the department.

3. Based on the teaching assignments allotted in the syllabus distribution, teachers prepare their "teaching plans" according to the number of lectures allotted in the university syllabus for each topic.

4. Class tests/surprise test and student seminars are held after completion of a section

of the syllabus and periodic review of performance of students is undertaken. 5.Classes are also held during the summer and puja vacations every year to keep pace with the curriculum of CBCS. 6.Field tours are organized by Departments of Botany, Zoology and B.Ed to ensure effective implementation of the prescribed curriculum. 7.Student satisfaction survey is conducted by IQAC to improve the teaching-learning process of each department. 8.Tutorial classes are held in some departments within class routine hours for which separate attendance registers are maintained.

#### Feedback Obtained

Members of anti ragging committee and Internal complaints committee also receive feedback from students through class campaigns. Mentoring of students is conducted by the departments of the institution. Mentoring of students is based on the following objectives: ? To increase the teacher-student contact hours ? To identify and address the problems faced by slow learners and first generation learners ? To encourage advanced learners ? To decrease the student drop-out rates ? To prepare students for the competitive world Every year, departments individually organize orientation sessions on the class commencement day for students of first semesters and explain the designing and implementation of the mentoring system of the department. Departmental teachers. In the mentoring process, all necessary information related to the student such as the contact number, email of the student, family income, category, gender etc are initially collected by the department through the student database format provided by the IQAC. Departments maintain the records of class tests/surprise tests, attendance records, records of student seminars etc related to the reviewing of the performance of the students. Departmental teachers maintain interaction with students through individual meetings, social networking sites and interaction boards of learning management system. Teachers discuss with parents during parent-teacher meetings and try to identify the problems faced by students and related issues. Time factor is a major constraint of the mentoring system, especially after introduction of the CBCS in 2017. To overcome this constraint, teachers sometimes suggest students to provide the list of difficult questions and problems faced by them while preparing for competitive examinations and then the teachers provide solutions in written form to the students. In some departments, tutorial classes are also organized for students. Outcome of the departmental mentoring system in the current year (2018-2019) 1. Significant improvement in the teacher-student relationship has been observed 3. Students won prizes in poster presentations, quiz competitions, Paintings, debates and other similar contests organized by external agencies. 4. Four Students won in InterCollege Tournaments Marshal Arts in 2019 and KHo KHO Games Inter College Tournaments in Kolhan University 2019. 5. Students have shown outstanding performance in sports tournaments. College has been declared as champion in different events of intercollege district sports and games championship, intercollege athletic championship state sports and games championship. One student has been awarded Governors silver medal (2018-2019) in shooting. He has also won state shooting championship and best NCC cadet award for the year 2018-2019. The biggest challenge of the mentoring system is to decrease the drop-out rates of the college due to shifting of students from general courses to Vocational Courses and at the beginning of each academic session. College has planned to introduce a mentoring guideline for all departments from the next academic session to address this problem.
